Students at Dartmouth College are expected to conduct themselves in a manner supportive of the educational mission of the institution. As representatives of the Dartmouth community, Greek letter organizations and their members agree to uphold and follow six guiding principles: fellowship, leadership, inclusivity, service, scholarship, and accountability. Additionally, when you join a Greek organization, you are agreeing to the following basic expectations:

- 1. Specific to hazing, I will not violate the State of New Hampshire's statute(s) or Dartmouth College's policy(ies) related to hazing: <u>Hazing Policy | Dartmouth Student Affairs</u>.
- 2. I will know and understand the ideals expressed in my chapter's founding documents, mission, and/or values statement and will strive to incorporate them in my daily life.
- 3. I will support a positive, alcohol-free new member education program.
- 4. I will not harass individuals, physically or verbally, oral or written.
- 5. I will not threaten the mental health, physical health or safety of any person or persons including via hazing, drug or alcohol abuse, and other forms of harmful behavior.
- 6. I will not intentionally disrupt or obstruct the lawful activities of the College or its members.
- 7. I will not allow or participate in theft of or damage to chapter, personal, College, private or public property or services.
- 8. I will not physically harm or threaten physical harm to any person or persons, including but not limited to assault, sexual abuse, or other forms of physical abuse.
- 9. I will neither use nor support the illegal purchase, use, possession or distribution of alcohol, drugs or controlled substances.
- 10. I will respect the health and safety of all living beings.
- 11. I acknowledge that the Chapter property- privately owned or otherwise- represents the Greek and College communities and will, therefore, assist in ensuring it is well-maintained and safe for myself, chapter members and guests. Further, I realize a clean and attractive environment is essential to both physical and mental health.
- 12. The Greek Letter Organization will not tolerate or condone any form of sexually abusive behavior on the part of its members, whether physical, mental, or emotional. This is to include any actions which are demeaning to any person or persons including but not limited to sexual assault or verbal harassment.
- 13. I understand as outlined in the <u>Group Accountability Statement | Community Standards & Accountability</u> that actions or inactions of individual members may impact the standing of the Greek organization to which I am a member. Specifically:
 - [...] that unacceptable behaviors by individuals functioning as members or officers of a student organization may have consequences for those individuals as well as for the organization. Also, the privilege of being an officer of a student organization carries with it particular responsibility for the reasonable anticipation and prevention of foreseeable violations of College policies, resulting from either deliberate or negligent behavior of the organization's members or guests.

Correspondingly, I realize the reputation of one chapter can impact the reputation of the entire Greek community.

- 14. I will fulfill all financial obligations set forth by the relevant governing council, the chapter to which I belong, and/or its national organization.
- 15. I will abide by and meet all academic expectations set by the College, Greek Life, the relevant governing council(s), my Chapter, and/or its national organization.
- 16. I will abide by all behavioral expectations set by the College, Chapter, and/or national organization.
