# Some Principles for Choosing Classes

- Keep the “liberal arts” mission in mind as you choose classes. Explore a range of subjects. Don’t make the mistake of thinking your education lies in the information you memorize.
- Explore
  - NB: For the class of 2018: 69% (748 out of 1086) did *not* major in what they thought they were going to study, or what they listed as their principal academic interest, when they arrived to campus. And 77% (835 out of 1086) majored in something other than they thought they would when they arrived.
- Make sure you have at least one small class
- Consider foreign study (LSAs, FSPs)
- Think about opportunities for research or other intellectual collaboration (ex: WISP, etc.)
