Congratulations on your upcoming graduation! The Undergraduate Deans Office looks forward to celebrating alongside graduates, families, and other supporters on Commencement Day. To ensure that you receive a diploma after completing all academic and degree requirements, please review the list below and resolve these items by the stated deadlines. If these obligations remain unresolved on Commencement Day (Sunday June 9<sup>th</sup>), you will not receive a diploma when diplomas are distributed in Baker Library following the Commencement ceremony. You will receive your diploma by mail after our office has been notified that all obligations have been settled.

# 1. LIBRARY: Deadline — Tuesday, June 4, 7 pm

Please return all library items no later than the above deadline. Items may be returned in person, or they may be placed in the book return in the Novack Café. If you believe you have lost materials, replacement costs can be paid in person at the Baker Circulation desk or over the phone. Fines and fees will be transferred to DASH through May 20. # 2. COLLEGE BILLS: <u>Deadline — Friday, June 7, 4 pm</u>

## 3. SHORT-TERM LOANS AND INTEREST PAYMENTS: Deadline — Monday, June 3, 4 pm

#### 4. LONG-TERM FINANCIAL AID LOANS:

All students with long-term financial aid loans must complete an online Exit Counseling session for each loan. There are two types of sessions: one for students with <u>Federal Direct Loans</u> and/or one for borrowers of <u>College loan funds</u> (<u>including Federal Perkins Loans</u>). All sessions require personal references and parent/guardian contact information. You will need to provide name, address, and telephone number for all references.

## FEDERAL DIRECT LOANS: Deadline — Friday, May 31, 12 p.m.

# COLLEGE LOANS (including Federal Perkins Loans): <u>Deadline — Friday, May 24, 12 p.m.</u>

Exit Counseling for College loan funds will be completed online. You should have received an email from <a href="webmaster@ecsi.net">webmaster@ecsi.net</a> the week of May 1, explaining how to complete the process using the Heartland/ECSI website (<a href="https://heartland.ecsi.net/">https://heartland.ecsi.net/</a>).
