HOW WILL YOU ARRANGE YOUR REMAINING TERMS AT DARTMOUTH?

Definition of "D-Plan" = A Student's Enrollment Pattern

- Terms enrolled on campus
- Term(s) enrolled off campus
- Leave terms

Your D-Plan is an agreement with the College and confirmation of where you intend to be each term.

It is important that your enrollment pattern accurately reflects your current plans at least two terms in advance.

Deadline

for submitting your D-Plan is **4:00 p.m. on** April 14, 2022.

Begin Thinking Now

about your D-Plan and make appointments to meet with your Undergraduate Dean and/or Faculty Advisor well in advance of the deadline.

Details:

- The D-Plan you submit will consist of twelve "R" terms and three "L" terms.
- You may have at the most, seven fall or spring "R" terms, therefore your plan will include at least one "L" term in the fall or spring of sophomore, junior, or senior year.
- You are expected to be in residence (R) during the summer term that immediately follows your sophomore year. You may substitute any other summer term in residence instead of sophomore summer.

Factors to Consider When Exploring D-Plan Options:

- Intended major and/or minor
- Courses that are only offered in specific terms
- Off-campus programs of interest
- Internships or research opportunities
- Extracurricular activities
- Preferred spacing of vacations
- Family resources
- Students typically graduate in twelve terms.

Your D-Plan should be the product of careful thinking and reflection: use this process to clarify your goals and the steps you will take to achieve them.

The only two letters you need to know are "R" and "L". BUT WHAT DO THEY MEAN?

R = **Residence**

[In residence taking courses or studying for Dartmouth credit on an off-campus or exchange program] You are **REQUIRED** to be "IN **RESIDENCE**" for one summer term* AND all three terms of your <u>first year</u> as well as two terms of your <u>senior year</u>.

As you think about which other RESIDENCE terms to select, you will want to consider **both academic and non-academic factors**.

When you submit your D-Plan choices in April, the Registrar will ask you to enter "R" for any term you are enrolled and taking classes, participating in a Dartmouth Off-Campus Program ("O"), or on a Dartmouth Exchange Program ("X").

L = Leave

[Away from campus for employment, time off, internship, transfer term]

On the D-Plan you submit, you are REQUIRED to take THREE leave terms. ONE leave term must be in the FALL or SPRING of either sophomore, junior, or senior year.

Please note: While Dartmouth does not give academic credit for **internships**, an internship during a leave term can help you gain skills and experience, as well as explore careers.
