HOW WILL YOU ARRANGE YOUR REMAINING TERMS AT DARTMOUTH?

Definition of "D-Plan" = A Student's Enrollment Pattern

- Terms enrolled on campus
- Term(s) enrolled off campus
- Leave terms

Your D-Plan is an agreement with the College and confirmation of where you intend to be each term.

It is important that your enrollment pattern accurately reflects your current plans at least two terms in advance.

Deadline

for submitting your D-Plan is
4:00 p.m. on April 11, 2024.

Begin Thinking Now about your D-Plan and make appointments to meet with your Undergraduate Dean and/or Faculty Advisor well in advance of the deadline.

Details:

- The D-Plan you submit will consist of twelve On/Residence (R) terms and three Off/Leave (L) terms.
- You may have at the most, seven fall or spring On/Residence (R) terms, therefore your plan will include at least one Off/Leave (L) term in the fall or spring of sophomore, junior, or senior year.
- You are expected to be On/Residence (R) during the summer term that immediately follows your sophomore year. You may substitute any other summer term in residence instead of sophomore summer.

Factors to Consider When Exploring D-Plan Options:

- Intended major and/or minor
- Courses that are only offered in specific terms
- Off-campus programs of interest
- Internships or research opportunities
- Extracurricular activities
- Preferred spacing of vacations
- Family resources
- Students typically graduate in twelve terms.

Your D-Plan should be the product of careful thinking and reflection: use this process to clarify your goals and the steps you will take to achieve them.

Important terms you need to know: On/Residence (R) term and Off/Leave (L) term.

On/Residence

[In residence taking courses or studying for Dartmouth credit on an off-campus or exchange program]

You are **REQUIRED** to be "IN RESIDENCE" for one summer term* **AND** all three terms of your first year as well as two terms of your senior year.

As you think about which other RESIDENCE terms to select, you will want to consider both academic and non-academic factors.

When you submit your D-Plan in April, the Registrar will ask you to enter "On/Residence" for any term you are enrolled and taking classes, participating in a Dartmouth Off-Campus Program ("O"), or on a Dartmouth Exchange Program ("X").

Off/Leave

[Away from campus for employment, time off, internship, transfer term]

On the D-Plan you submit, you are **REQUIRED** to take **THREE** Off/Leave terms. **ONE** Off/Leave term must be in the **FALL** or **SPRING** of either sophomore, junior, or senior year.

Please note: While Dartmouth does not give academic credit for internships, an internship during a leave term can help you gain skills and experience, as well as explore careers.

R

“On/Residence”
[In residence taking courses, or studying for Dartmouth credit on an off-campus or exchange program]

On your D-Plan, if you plan to take an “O” (Off-Campus Program) term and/or an “X” (Dartmouth Exchange Program) term, leave them as “R” terms. Once your “O” and “X” programs have been approved, the Registrar will update your D-Plan with those designations. For visa status, R = O = X; they are all enrolled terms that count toward the full-academic year requirement.

O = “Off-Campus Program” [Dartmouth's term length, credit carrying, faculty-directed study away programs]

X = “Exchange” [academic term(s) on a Dartmouth-sponsored Exchange Program at one of 30+ exchange partner institutions worldwide]

- The “O” and “X” terms represent Dartmouth’s unique study away opportunities. During their first year, students should think about how study away programs can fit into their academic plan.
- Once students have completed their first-year requirements, they may participate in a Dartmouth-sponsored study away program. Students can apply to programs in advance of completing the requirements.
- Applications to study away in the following academic year are due to the Guarini Institute by February 1st.
- If you qualify for financial aid, that aid will apply to both faculty-directed and exchange programs.
- You can study away for up to 3 terms during your Dartmouth career.

- **Be advised:** Students on exchange programs must apply to earn transfer credit. This **REQUIRES** prior approval from the Dartmouth academic department/program and the Registrar.

L

“Off/Leave”
[Away from campus for employment, time off, internship, or transfer term]

When you submit your D-Plan, you will list a “T” term (Transfer) as an “Off/Leave” term, as well as those terms on “Off/Leave,” when you are away from campus for employment, internship, or time off.

REMINDER → On the D-Plan you submit, you are required to take **THREE** off/leave terms. On **ONE** of your submitted D-Plans, **ONE** off/leave term must be in the **FALL or SPRING** of either **sophomore, junior, or senior** year.

T = “Transfer” [Transfer credits from another institution]

It is possible to enroll in courses at another accredited four-year liberal arts institution for Dartmouth credit.

- See your Undergraduate Dean about how your **Transfer Credit** plans **align with your academic goals and program**.
- **Be advised:** Transfer Credit **REQUIRES** review and approval by a sub-committee of the Committee on Instruction, the Registrar, and the Departments/Programs accepting transfer of the courses.
