SVPP Objective & Outcomes

Our overarching objective is to reduce harmful behavior (sexual assault, relationship violence, stalking, harassment, etc.) by increasing positive behavior.

The curriculum is designed to empower students to prevent harm by cultivating and strengthening their interpersonal skills and self-efficacy to:

- 1. Develop **Positive Relationships** & positive **Sex**ual behavior (**PRS**)
- 2. Use their **Power** in positive ways to foster **Equity & Belonging** (**PEB**)
- 3. Check-in & step-in thru **Bystander Intervention**, across the spectrum of harm, to prevent sexual violence (**BI**)
- Use Resources, if needed, & Support those who have been impacted by sexual violence (e.g. sexual assault, relationship violence, stalking, and harassment) (RS)





SVPP Evaluation

Currently, there is very little academic research looking into the types of interventions that prevent sexual violence so Dartmouth has partnered with experts in sexual violence prevention research and evaluation, from Prevention Innovations Research Center (PIRC) at the University of New Hampshire (UNH) to study the SVPP. Students will interact with the evaluation by participating in the annual Culture, Behavior, & Experiences (CBE) survey, pre- and 6-week post training assessments, among others, and will have the opportunity to opt in or out of the academic research contributing to the body of science and prevention strategies at other institutions.

First-Year Experience

The SVPP curriculum was intentionally designed and developed through research and with the help of Dartmouth students. The First-Year Experience (FYE) is an **introduction** intended to ensure all incoming students are on the same level and can build on this foundation throughout their time at Dartmouth. First-Year trainings are facilitated by upper-level students and occur each term. First-years are **pre-registered** for all of their components and can change their session date/time in the SVP portal on DartHub.

Sophomores will practice applying the SYE material to their own lived experiences factoring in their impact on others, and the complexity and nuances they often encouter. Sophomores will **need to register** for components each term through the SVP portal on DartHub.

- Yes. The SVPP is part of the undergraduate Dartmouth experience and required for all students. The FYE is also a prerequisite to participate in Greek Life. Students who do not complete their requirements will be in violation of our Community Standards and receive a conduct sanction.
